The CEP uses information from other programs, including the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Temporary Assistance Program for Needy Families (TANF) instead of traditional paper applications. We are committed to providing every student in our school district with all the tools they need to succeed, including nutritious meals that everyone can enjoy together.

We are excited about this opportunity to provide nutritious meals at no charge to all of our students. Our hope is that more students will have access to meals that provide essential nutrients that are a necessary component to academic success. Meals will follow the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) guidelines for healthy school meals.
